POINT NO POINT TREATY COUNCIL IN-COMMON AREAS 12 & 12B SUMMER-FALL CHINOOK EVALUATION FISHERY REGULATIONS #F26-013

These regulations apply to Jamestown S'Klallam and Port Gamble S'Klallam off-reservation commercial net fisheries for Chinook salmon in Areas 12 and 12B.

These regulations do not modify annual Chinook regulation #F26-012 or annual troll regulation #F26-007.

SECTION I. GENERAL PROVISIONS

TOPIC 1. EFFECTIVE DATES

July 19, 2026 through August 22, 2026.

TOPIC 2. MANAGEMENT AREAS

These regulations shall apply to Management and Catch Reporting Areas 12 and 12B.

TOPIC 3. MANAGEMENT PERIODS

- a) Area: 12: July 5 through September 5
- b) Area: 12B: July 5 through September 12

TOPIC 4. LAWFUL GEAR

When fisheries are open under this regulation, the following gear types shall be lawful unless otherwise specified in this regulation or emergency regulations;

- a) Marine set and drift gillnets: 7" minimum mesh size.
- b) Gillnet length restrictions as follows:

Marine setnets limited to maximum length of 150 fathoms.

Drift gillnet length limited to maximum length of 330 fathoms

SECTION II. FISHERY AREA RESTRICTIONS

No marine gillnets may be operated within a 1,000 ft. radius around all waters within channels created by exposed tidelands of the Dosewallips, Duckabush, and Hamma Hamma rivers and around all stream mouths that are not open to net fishing. In Area 12 the mouth of Big Beef Creek is defined by the Seabeck Highway bridge crossing.

SECTION III. FISHERY OPENINGS

TOPIC 1. Fishing Period – Open for salmon species from 7/20 through the earliest of 8/19 or upon reaching the Treaty Evaluation Fishery harvest limit of 1,500 Chinook.

TOPIC 2. Days and Hours – Open Monday through Wednesday each week, from 6:15 am to 8:15 pm.

SECTION IV. OTHER RESTRICTIONS

Fishers must register with their natural resources department prior to participating;

All catch shall be retained;

All catch and bycatch shall be recorded on treaty commercial fish tickets;

Fishers must report all commercial and take-home catch of Chinook and Chum salmon to their NR department by phone or text within 48 hours of landing.

All catch must be made available to Port Gamble and Jamestown fisheries staff for sampling purposes;

Only one gillnet per fisher;

Gillnet must be tended while fishing;

Tribal buyers must return completed fish tickets to the fisheries office no later than 6 days following commercial harvest.

SECTION V. EMERGENCY REGULATIONS

Openings and restrictions outlined in these regulations may be modified at any time by emergency regulations, based on in-season management considerations. Fishery may be subject to emergency closure with short notice.

SECTION VI. EXPECTED EFFORT AND HARVEST

- a) Expected effort is submitted separately by the member Tribes.
- b) The Point No Point Treaty Council member area Tribes intend to fully harvest their lawful share of Chinook salmon.

SECTION VII. AUTHORITY

The above regulations are promulgated by the Point No Point Treaty Council under the authority delegated by its member tribes.



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
